Dear Hawthorn RSL Sub-Branch,

RSL Victoria Annual Conference Remits

Thank you for submitting your proposed remits for the 105th Annual Conference. All remits submitted prior to the 16th October have now been considered by an Agenda Sub-Committee established under rule 8.8.

The Annual Conference this year will be unique as it will for the first time be held online. In setting the agenda the Agenda Sub-Committee considered the medium of the meeting, the potential complexity and number of remits, the length of the meeting and the fact that the next Annual Conference will be less than eight months away.

I am writing to you on behalf of the Agenda Sub-Committee to advise that the Agenda Sub-Committee has considered each of your remits and proposes, subject to consultation, to accept, amend, omit, or reject various remits. These proposals are detailed in Annex A. Due to time constraints, we draw your attention to the following requested action:

- Review any proposed amendments and reply as accepted or propose an alternative wording.
- Review any proposed omission of remits and consider any changes you may wish to make which would satisfy the Agenda Sub-Committee that the remit is in a proper form for further consideration.

Responses to the above are requested in writing by 3pm on Thursday 29th October. The Agenda Sub-Committee is meeting for the final time on the morning of Friday 30th October. We appreciate that this is a tight timeframe, however the agenda must be distributed by the end of the month.

The State Branch has various avenues for changes to the Rules and Branch By-Laws to be submitted, reviewed, and amended where required. We encourage you to seek these avenues or alternatively you are welcome to submit the remits that have been rejected or omitted for inclusion on the 2021 Annual Conference Agenda.

This remit therefore proposes to omit this from remit from the agenda. The Agenda Sub-Committee also acknowledges that RSL National has recently approved a new strategy that has Advocacy and Lobbying as one of the 4 strategic themes.
3	Canvassing not permitted	Omitted	The Agenda Sub-Committee proposes to omit this remit as the matter is substantially similar to another accepted remit. The Sub-Branch may seek to propose amendments to the remit that appears on the agenda at the Annual Conference.
4	Composition of the State Executive 1	Amendment	The Agenda Sub-Committee has determined that this remit is deficient in its current form. The Agenda Sub-Committee note that this proposed remit be ought to be amended to reflect only the deletion of sub-clause 7.4(a)(4) together with subsequent necessary changes to the Rules to maintain internal consistency (noting that the

The remit: - includes an incomplete reference to the Rules, noting that term limits are already established in Rule 7.4(b) and 9.1(c). - Consequential amendments to other rules have not been identified - the rationale is deficient as the explanation for what the remit is trying to establish is unclear

Removal of references to the position of Immediate past State President

7.4 Composition of the State Executive

Delete sub clause 7.4(a)(5)

- 5) The immediate past State President (subject to Rule 9.5)
- who shall not have a vote.

Delete entire clause 9.5

9.5 Immediate past State President

- (a) The immediate past State President is entitled to be a member of the State Executive for the period of 12 months after having been replaced as State President, save and the earlier except upon retirement of their successor.
- (b) Rule 9.5(a) does not apply
- (c) the immediate past State President ceases to be a Member: or
- (d) the Annual Conference or an Extraordinary Conference resolves otherwise.

Amended Rationale:

Bad governance.

Only office bearers and no employee is a member of the state executive.

To ensure the primacy of the Membership in the affairs of the League, no employee or unelected person should serve on or ordinarily be privy to the deliberations of the State Executive.

			Employees or other persons not Members of the State Executive may report to the Executive on certain matters as required but should take no part in deliberations upon same.
15	Chief Executive Officer of the Branch 1	Omitted	The Agenda Sub-Committee understands the reasoning behind this proposed remit however due to the time constraints, the complexity of the factors behind the remit and the medium of the Annual Conference, this particular proposed remit is not appropriate for inclusion on the agenda for the 2020 Annual Conference.
			The Agenda Sub-Committee would like to acknowledge that a change in CEO can be incredibly disruptive for an organisation and can fracture the unity of the board along with potential contractual arrangements that would be affected by a change of this rule.
			We invite the Sub-Branch to submit it for inclusion on the agenda at the 2021 Annual Conference where the proper debate and discussion can occur.
16	Chief Executive Officer of the Branch 2	Rejected	The remit has no rationale provided. It is therefore non-compliant with Rule 8.8(b)(1) and has been rejected.
17	Branch Employees	Amendment	The Agenda Sub-Committee has identified that the wording needs to be amended and proposes to amend this remit to reflect an amended 9.8, 13.6(e)(2) & 13.6(I)(8).

18	State President and Chief Executive Officer right of address	Approved	The Agenda Sub-Committee has approved this proposed remit and it will appear on the Agenda
19	Election of a Branch Officer	Omitted	The Agenda Sub-Committee has identified that the proposed remit is not clear as it does not adequately define what the proposed remit is. A Rule remit must clearly set out which rule(s) are being amended and the specific wording of said amendments or inclusions. It is also noted that the Agenda Sub-Committee propose to omit the remit as this issue has already been covered in part by an earlier submitted proposed remit. The Sub-Branch may seek to propose amendments to the remit that appears on the agenda at the Annual Conference.
20	Sources of funds of the Branch	Omitted	The Agenda Sub-Committee has identified that the proposed remit is deficient, unclear in its drafting and is exceptionally broad and far reaching. However, the Agenda Sub-Committee understands the reasoning behind this proposed remit however due to the time constraints, the complexity of the factors behind the remit, COVID-19

			situation, and the impacts this has had on the Annual Conference, the necessity to put this forward to Sub-Branches has been identified that this particular proposed remit is not appropriate for inclusion on the agenda for the 2020 Annual Conference however we invite the Sub-Branch to re-write and submit it for inclusion on the agenda at the 2021 Annual Conference where the proper debate and discussion can occur.
21	New Rule Membership Card	Rejected	The Agenda Sub-Committee has identified that this is not a proposed Rule Remit nor is it in a proper format. Branding on the membership card can be discussed and dealt with in other forums.
